- The Avon Heathcote Estuary Ihutai Trust Mother of All Cleanups took place on Saturday 10 May 2024. RRA, led by Chris Doudney, is responsible each year for the area of Beachville Road from the Reserve to the Causeway. 10 people attended and 10 bags of rubbish were found. Among the findings was a gold watch which was passed to Tanya Jenkins, Manager of the Avon Heathcote Estuary Ihutai Trust. - Martin reported that he had made a submission on the CCC LTP, his key topic being commendations for the Rangers who have helped with the Barnett Park Regreening project.

 - c. Newsletter, community and social events, fundraising. Evan reported that he is planning a community event in July or August with the theme 'Aging Curiously'. He will be talking to the Bowling Club AKA Club Redcliffs, and seeking sponsorship for food, as well as inviting local organisations to attend with a display. Two speakers as last year's

event are considered a good number. Evan and Martin will be developing these ideas.

f. Regreening Barnett Park and Predator Free Redcliffs:

- Martin reported that the next project will be weeding the bluffs, with climbers abseiling down from permanent fixed anchor points that will be used each year when re-weeding is required.
- There is a delay in naturalizing the stream, but meanwhile several grass lizards have been found (as expected, as they were found in an earlier exploratory project).
- A new bridge will be built below the cave
- Planting preparation is planned but at the moment the ground is too hard and dry
- The group is developing a positive relationship with Ngati Wheke, and the idea has been floated that Redcliffs become a Historic Precinct, due to the significant findings in the area.

g. Response and Resilience Team, emergency planning.

- Chris D and Evan attended a meeting with the members of the Sumner Hub, where matters of emergency management and recovery, and evacuation were discussed. RRA appreciates being invited and involved in this project and will be happy to share information about the RRRTeam activities to date. Communication and sharing between the Sumner, Redcliffs and Mt Pleasant groups is considered vital. Andrea's report of the evening meeting and a list of Sumner contact details is copied at the end of this report.
- Chris D has sent a message thanking the Sumner group for including RRA, and offering to cover the cost of his and Evan's share of the food. Christine will also send a letter to Andrea regarding keeping in contact and sharing phone numbers in the first instance, and possibly sharing practice events as suggested by Pat some time ago.

Hi all

Please find attached a copy of the cash-flow statement as of end-April 2024.

You will see that we received \$21,175.61 during April. The majority of this was a grant from Rata Foundation of \$20,000 for the Barnett Park project. We also received the half-yearly GST refund of \$1090.41 (which I have allocated back to the Barnett Park Project as they incurred more or less all of the GST payments), a receipt of \$55.00 for trap sales along with interest on the bank account of \$30.20.

Expenditure for the month totaled \$150.88, which was a \$30.88 bill with My Host for our web-hosting along with a reimbursement of \$120.00 to Pat for secretarial expenses (6 months).

The month end bank balance stood at \$36,234.39.

By the end of 2024

- Confirm and agree on some simple message for the two times of day scenarios.
- Place on the SCRA Website, along with usual Social Media marketing
- Conduct a survey (digital)
- Run at least one event for grab bag building
- Publicise the Map the CD meeting points in Sumner and Redcliffs(Sumner School has their evacuation plan to Van Ash ,what is Redcliffs plan)
